EADA Business School moves up four places in the ranking

90% of programme participants are international

Barcelona, 12th September 2022. According to the ranking published today by leading British newspaper the *Financial Times*, EADA's International Master in Management programme has maintained its position in a select group of top international programmes, improving its 2021 ranking by moving up four places to number 33, and consolidating its 3-year position in the top 40.

According to Programme Director, Antony Poole, "this improvement in the rankings holds a lot of merit, as the real challenge for business schools lies in maintaining and consolidating their position. This is especially significant in a global environment where there is an increasing amount of competition".

The ranking is based on various parameters including faculty, diversity, financial investment, career progression, salary and employability three months after completing the programme. The International Master in Management is designed for recent graduates and aims to help them enter the job market and boost their careers.

To be eligible to take part in the ranking, the *Financial Times* requires all schools to be internationally accredited by <u>EQUIS</u> or AACSB (Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business).

EADA Business School Barcelona was founded in 1957 by a group of entrepreneurs and professionals as an ideologically and economically independent institution. As well as appearing in the international rankings of well-known publications such as the Financial Times or The Economist, it holds the EQUIS accreditation from the EFMD (European Foundation for Management Development) and the AMBA which recognises the quality of MBA programmes.
